Who Doesn't "Keep America Beautiful?"

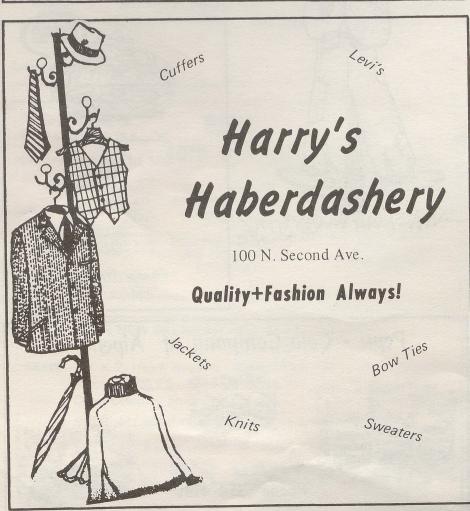
NEW YORK (LNS) -- Keep America Beautiful Inc. -- who coined the words "People Start Pollution. People Can Stop It" -- have a new ad idea. According to the public service group's executive vice-president, Robert Powers, "a high degree of awareness to the various pollution problems exists now," and it's time to tell people that "individuals are not powerless to correct ecology problems.

The new ad campaign will, according to Advertising Age, portray eight instances of people polluting through littering. In each case, a passerby will chide the offenders. But the people behind Keep America Beautiful (KAB) do not follow their own advice. Formed in 1953 by

some of the largest corporation heads in the country, KAB's board of directors to-day includes top representatives of the American Can Co., Pepsi Cola, Continental Can Co., the Brewers Assoc., and the Glass Container Manufacturers Institute--chief proponents of the profitable flip-top throw away cans and no-return bottles that this country is littered with.

As Environmental Action put it, "KAB was formed by polluters to convince America that all those unrecycled cans and bottles and all that excess packaging should be disposed of 'properly.' "





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
