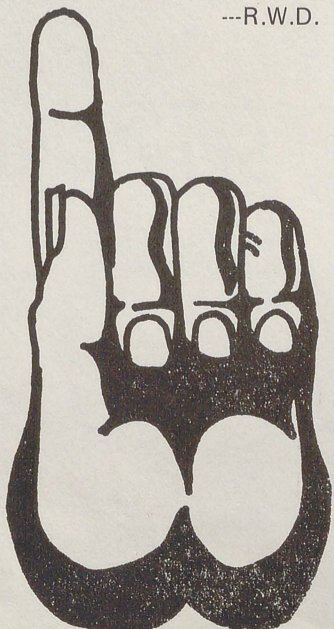

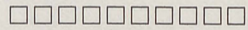

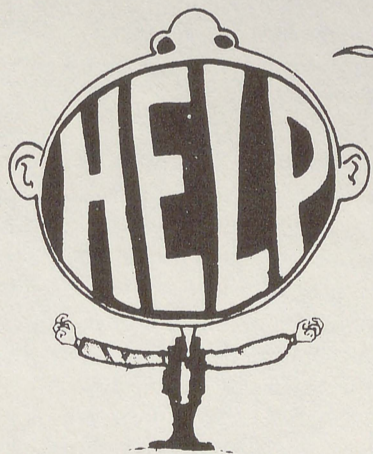
"Dusty and Sweets McGee" January 31, and February 2, 1974. The times will be posted in the "Log" and "Splinter".

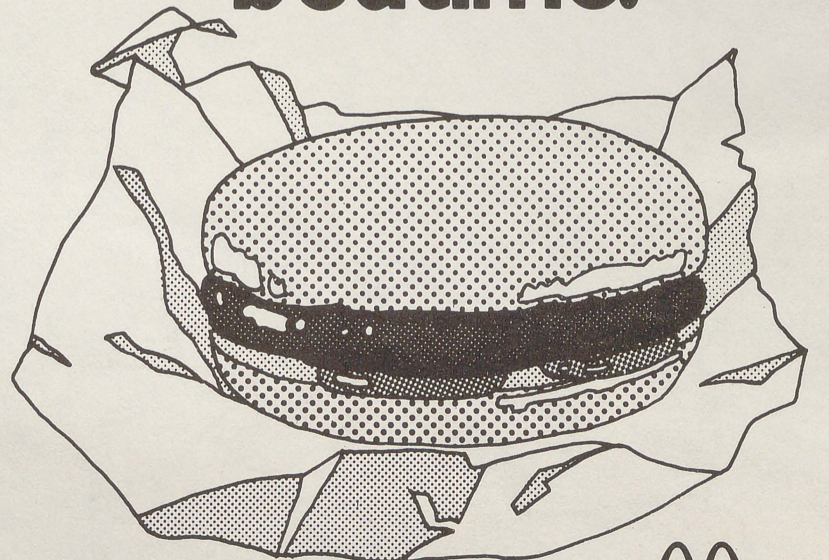
