Taking advantage of educational benefits offered through the Veterans Administration (VA) under the GI Bill are 334 vets representing all branches of the service.

Don Pregizer, Veterans Outreach Coordinator at ACC, indicates that the vet enrollment is slightly down from last fall but parallels the overall lower number of students registered at the college this term. The figure includes 84 vets presently attending classes at Wurthsmith Air Force Base, Oscoda.

Vets are reminded that the Pursuit of Education slips are required by Federal Regulation and must be submitted monthly to the Veterans Outreach Office. Failure to comply results in automatic termination of benefits.

A recent news item from the Bay City Times (UPI) related that the 94th Congress, prior to adjournment, had passed legislation increasing the VA education benefits by 8 percent and reinstating the education benefits for volunteers.

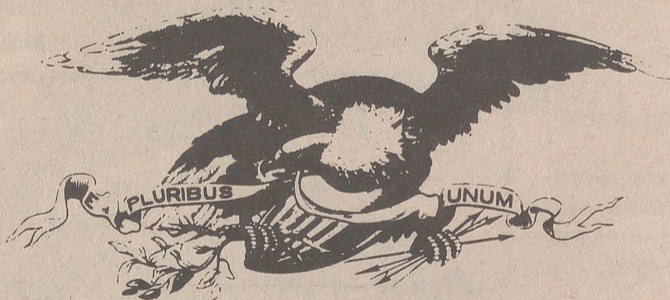
