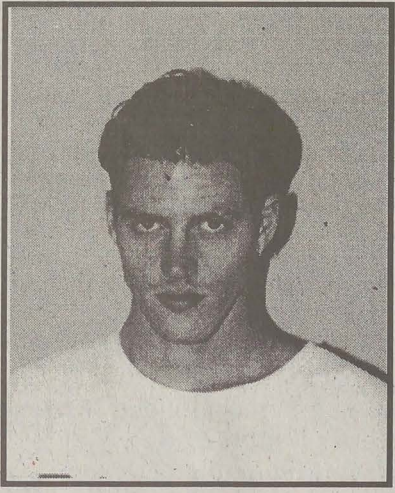


Meet the 1999 Polemic Staff

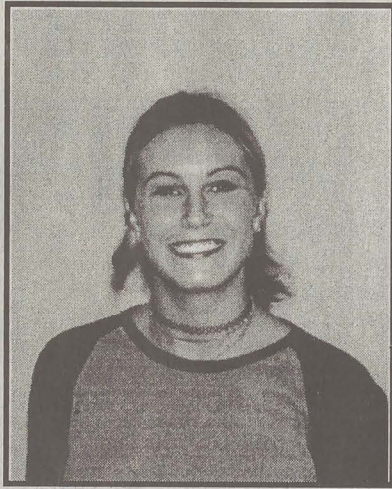
Melinda Yax

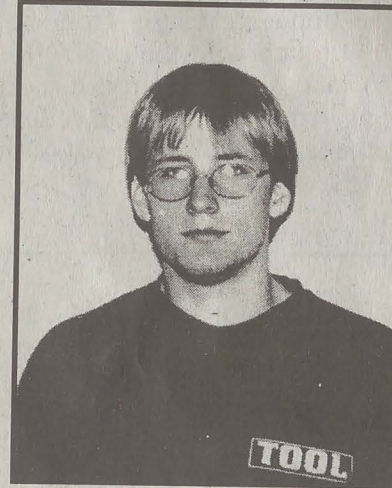
Jessica Rutan
