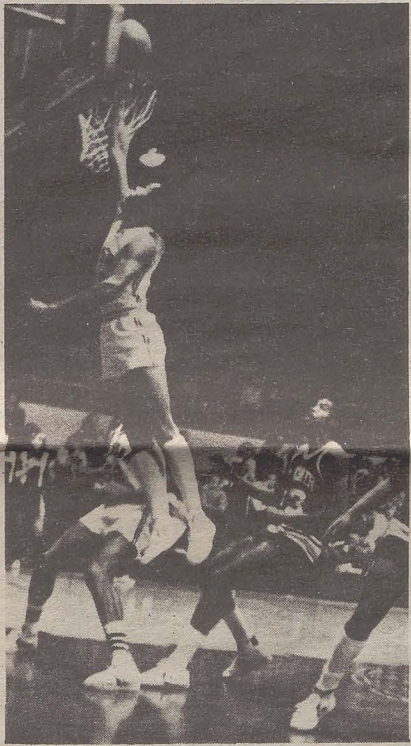
The Alpena Community College Lumberjills came back to Alpena Friday, January 26 with a triumph over Schoolcraft, 76 to 57.

## I.M. BASKETBALL IS HERE AGAIN

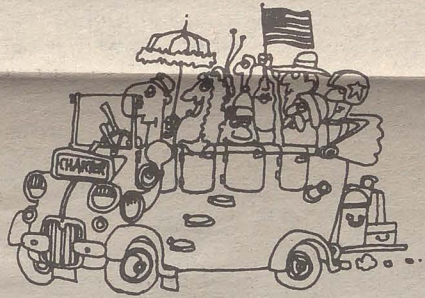

The Alpena Community College Lumberjacks suffered a 68-54 conference loss at Macomb on Sat., Feb. 3, putting their record at 12-7 for the season.

With Alonzo Weatherly scoring 9 points, leaving Earl Buckingham the only 'Jack' with double figure scoring at 17 points, Coach Schray stated, "Our boys were just not playing like they should. They looked as though they were tired. I just can't believe it."

Macomb's Mike Zathoff led Macomb to a victory with 24 points, while Coadie Kothwill added 16 points at a winning cause.

Saturday's loss put the Lumberjacks at 8 conference wins and 4 losses for the season.

**Alpena 108, St. Clair 71**

At the East Campus gym last Wednesday night, the ACC Lumberjacks registered their eleventh win

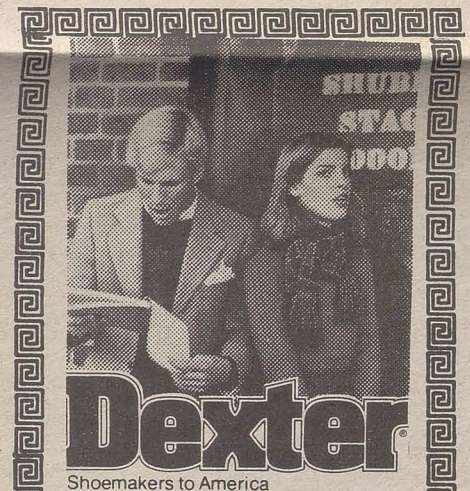
There will be something new in ACC sports this spring - Women's fastpitch softball.
