county elections.) There are two candidates for the position of sheriff. There are two candidates for the position of county clerk. There is one candidate for the position of county treasurer. There is one candidate for the position of register of deeds. There are two candidates for the position of drain commissioner. There are also three separate proposals concerning the judicial branch of government. You can choose between five candidates to elect two members to the Michigan

The more things change . . .

(No-cR) Imagine a school where the students' main concern is a well-paying job after graduation and where the primary disciplinary problem is drunkenness.

That description fits many a modern university. But, says U. of Southern California history professor Paul Knoll, it also depicts Poland's U. of Cracow --- in the 14th century.

Through 10 years of research, Knoll has learned that campus life in that time period is uncannily similar to that of the present day. Old disciplinary records show students were punished most often for drunkenness, but also for being disrespectful to teachers, stealing and cavorting with women. Cracow also had problems with racial tensions on campus. The discord reached such proportions that different sects, including Hungarian, German and Czechoslovakian students, were housed in separate dormitories.

Knoll believes there is much to be learned from the 14th century and plans to write a book on Cracow's history and its relationship to modern institutions. His work already reaffirms the basic notion that some things never change -- the typical student letter home, for example, was punctuated by the familiar phrase "Please send money..."
