**FRUIT KABOBS & DRESSING**

- |  |                               |
|--|-------------------------------|
| 1 small avocado, cut 1/2 in squares                          | 8 maraschino cherries         |
| 1 can (13 1/2 oz.) pineapple chunks, drained (reserve juice) | 2 bananas, cut in 1/2" slices |

Dip slices of banana and avocado into pineapple juice. Alternate chunks of pineapple with slices of banana and avocado on 5" to 7" skewers. Place a cherry on the end of each skewer. Place skewer on platter of salad greens. Dip kabobs into Pineapple Fruit Salad Dressing (see below). Makes 8 kabobs.

**DRESSING**

- |                         |                              |
|-------------------------|------------------------------|
| 3 tbsp. pineapple juice | 2 egg yolks, slightly beaten |
| 1/8 tsp. salt           | 1 tbsp. cornstarch           |
| 1/2 cup of sugar        | 2 tbsp. lemon juice          |
| 1/3 cup water           |                              |

Mix cornstarch and sugar. Add egg yolks and water. Cook over direct heat, bringing mixture to a boil. Boil 1 min., stirring constantly. Remove from heat. Add juices and salt. Cool, Serve in a dish long and deep enough to fit skewer. Makes 1 cup dressing.

Another key issue in the bargaining process was establishment of a due process-just cause discipline and dismissal procedure for instructors who were under the Michigan Teacher Tenure Act in former contracts before the college became separate.

One concern the faculty had was academic freedom. In some school systems in the U.S., the usage of some books are being banned in classrooms; either because of pictures or literature not being considered up to the standards of the community. However, it was granted, that if the material fits the class and it's standards are consistent with accepted professional practice, then it can be used.

The ratified pact is retroactive to Aug. 25, 1980, and will expire on Aug. 23, 1982.

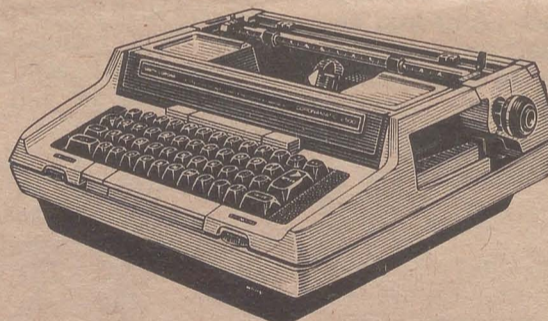

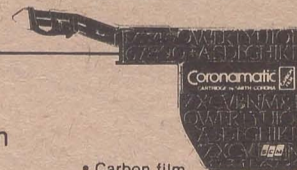

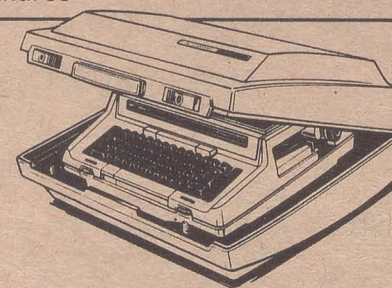
