

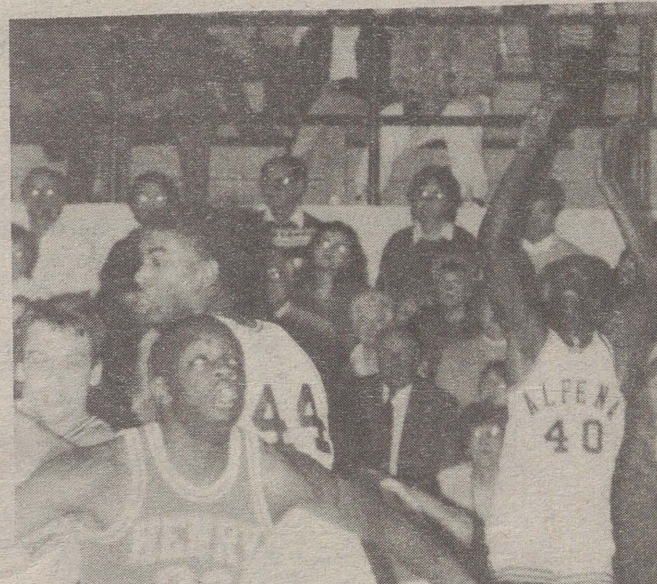
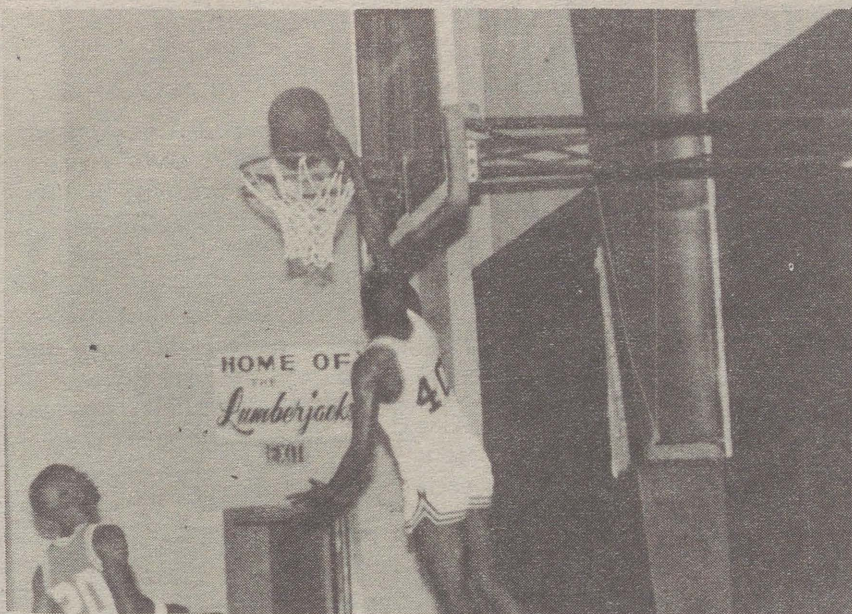
HOMECOMING--GAME AND HALFTIME ACTIVITIES

The Jacks dropped the homecoming game 83-65.

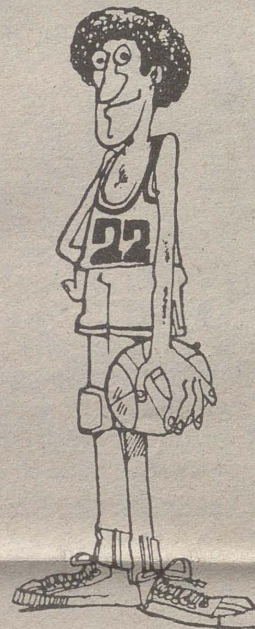
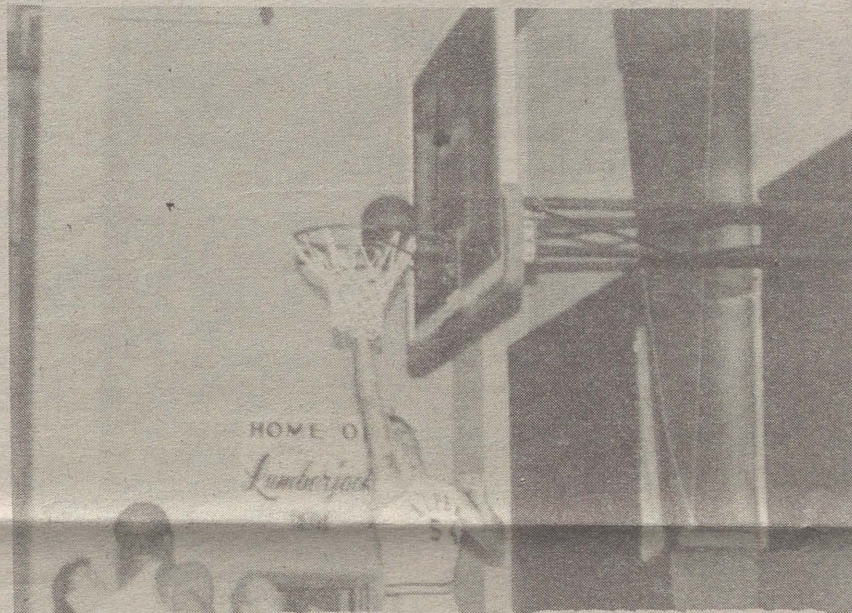


The Lady Lumberjacks played a tight game and overcame odds to beat Henry Ford 68-62.
