Need help pursuing your career goals? Then the Planning and Placement Office (CPPO) located in rm. 100 BTC is the place for you

The CPPO is affiliated with the Michigan College and University Placement Association and the Midwest College Placement Association.

The CPPO offers computer-based occupational exploration programs which can help you assess your interests as well as obtain job outlook information. These programs include: SIGI PLUS (System of Interactive Guidance Information), MOIS (Michigan Occupational Information System), and Discover for the Adult Learner.

A career guidance library and two full-time counselors are available to discuss your career goals.

Everything from putting together a resume and writing the cover letter, to information on interviewing and how to look for a

job is available.

Job placement is an essential function of the CPPO. Some of the services they work with are: work study placement for current ACC students, part-time employment for current and graduated ACC students, full-time employment for ACC graduates, and summer employment.

You can register for the Placement service by filling out and signing a credentials form and turning it in to the CPPO.

One place that does operatewithin the Alpena Community is the Ox Bow Center. The service was began by the administrator of curriculum specifically for teen mothers. Now it is open for the entire community and is actively seeking participants. The Ox Bow Center accepts three, four and five year olds from 7:30 am- 3:30 pm.

If any person wishes to express a need for day care facilities they should contact the Volunteer Center or submit a letter to the Lumberjack.

The committee investigating day care feasibility is also considering developing a program for latchkey children.
