Guest speakers for the club include: FBI agent Ron Smith, speakers from the Secret Service, and Federal Parole and Probation Officer Dennis Roy.

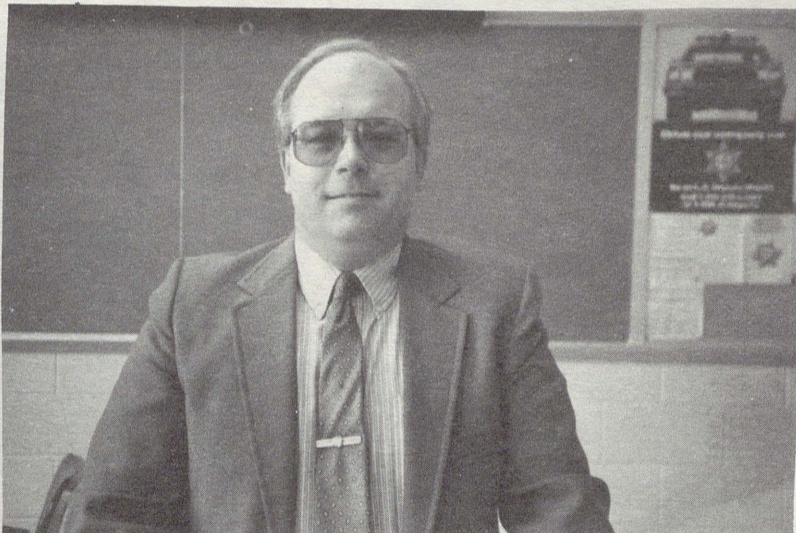
