O APPLICATION Stop by or phone Alpena Community College in Alpena or Oscoda to get an ACC Application for Admission. Complete and submit it. It's free; there is no application fee at ACC. ③

2 ASSESSMENT Check out the dates and times listed on Page 9 for the Assessment of Skills for Successful Entry and Transfer (ASSET) and attend the testing most convenient for you in Alpena or Oscoda. It's free; there is no charge at ACC for placement assessment. ^(C)

3 ADVISING Meet with the academic advisor assigned when your application was processed. They have scheduled office hours during registration week to help students plan the best course of study toward their educational goals. It's free; there is no charge at ACC for advising and counseling. ⁽³⁾

4 REGISTRATION Choose the most convenient time to register at Alpena (see Page 6) or Oscoda (see Page 4). Bring the registration form filled out with your advisor, turn it in and pay the tuition and fees for your course(s). Yes, at this step, you *do* have to pay. Even so, the rates are lower than a four-year school (see below) . . . and parking is free! ^(C)

Full refund (100%) of all tuition paid will be issued provided a Drop/ Add Form is processed and in the possession of the Campus Services Office (Van Lare Hall 108) in Alpena or the Huron Shores Campus Office at Oscoda prior to 3:30 p.m. the last day of enrollment for the semester. Spring classes may be added or dropped with tuition refund through Friday, Jan. 23, 1998, by submitting a completed Drop/Add Form and a \$5 fee for each form processed.
