

## GOOD REASON #1 For The Earning Power

More than 24% of the population over age 23 have a college degree, and 25% of those are associate's degrees earned at a community college or technical institute.

According to the American Association of Community Colleges (AACC), the average annual earnings of a person with an associate's degree is almost \$5,000 more than that of a person with only a high school diploma, and about \$8,000 annually more than a person with no high school diploma. Over the course of a working lifetime, a community college graduate earns about \$1 million - almost \$250,000 more than someone with only a high school diploma.

Regardless of the career path or college, most every college degree has a common denominator of "basic" courses (or core curriculum).

They include English composition,

sciences, mathematics, social sciences and humanities/fine arts.

The average annual tuition at a public four-year university is about \$4,747. Full-time 1997-98 tuition at ACC is just \$1,530 for district residents and \$2,250 for non-district state residents.

ACC participates in state and federal financial aid programs and the ACC Foundation offers both need-based and merit-based scholarships. And the new federal Hope Scholarship tax credit can make the first two years of higher education even more affordable.


