the BELL HOMESTEAD

an important page from the past



THE INTERIOR OF THE BELL HOMESTEAD —
TUTELA HEIGHTS
(see Map for Directions)

This is the former home of Alexander Graham Bell, the inventor of the Telephone. Located on Tutela Heights Road, it is furnished as it was in the 1874 period when the Bell family lived there. Close by is the "Henderson Home", which was the first telephone office in Canada. The Rev. Thos. Henderson was the first general agent in Canada for the Telephone Company.

The Bell Homestead is OPEN daily from June 1 to Sept. 30 between the hours of 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. In addition, the Bell Homestead is open from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. during the month of October, April and May, though closed on Mondays during Oct. 1 to May 31.

THE BELL MEMORIAL

This impressive memorial located on West Street commemorates the invention of the Telephone in Brantford. It was unveiled on October 21, 1917, by Alexander Graham Bell.

BRANT HISTORICAL MUSEUM

Located at 57 Charlotte St., it includes Indian Pioneer relics of Brant County, a Pioneer Kitchen, as well as a Victorian Parlor and rooms of other periods. Open May to August (daily) from 2 to 5 p.m., Sept. to April from 2 to 5 p.m. (Tue., Thur., Sat. & Sun.). Visits can be arranged by calling the Curators at 752-2483. (Closed Mondays all year).

CHIEFSWOOD

The birthplace and home of Emily Pauline Johnson, Indian Poetess. Featuring many relics from Pauline Johnson, the home is furnished in the style of the 1870 era and is located on Highway 54. 

- a Trip through the World Of Telecommunications


Geodesic dome called TELESCIENCE 100, housing the past, present and future of telecommunications, will be featured in three parts with two involving "hands on" or audience participation.

The first chamber will accent historical artifacts and pictures dating back to the early days of the telephone and telegraphy.

The second chamber is a 60-seat theatre environment where a multimedia colour presentation of contemporary communications will be presented every 15 or 20 minutes. It will project the lifestyle of the year 2000 and the expected telecommunications services of that era.

The third chamber, as well as the first, will be a free-flow area where visitors can use a picturephone, compare the dialing speed of a rotary phone and a Touch-Tone one, see how various types of telephone switching equipment activate phone calls and inspect the other wonders of telecommunications.

LORNE PARK

The park is located just over the Lorne Bridge and west of downtown Brantford, on Colborne Street. It features a floral display showing the Bell Homestead, Alexander Graham Bell, the Bell Canada logo, "Bell Centennial 1874-1974", and large carpet beds (80 feet x 15 feet) showing the telephone. Beautiful rose gardens are present, too.

WAR MEMORIAL SHOWPIECE

Situated on Brant Avenue, it features floral displays of the Jaycees (Junior Chamber of Commerce) and the I. O. D. E. (Independent order of the Daughters of the Empire).

GLENHYRST GARDENS


This is a beautiful 16 acre estate overlooking the Grand River, with picturesque grounds and a nature trail. HER MAJESTY'S CHAPEL OF THE MOHAWKS


The chapel, the only Indian Chapel Royal in the world, is located on Mohawk Road. It was built in 1785, shortly after the arrival of the Six Nations on the Grand River.
