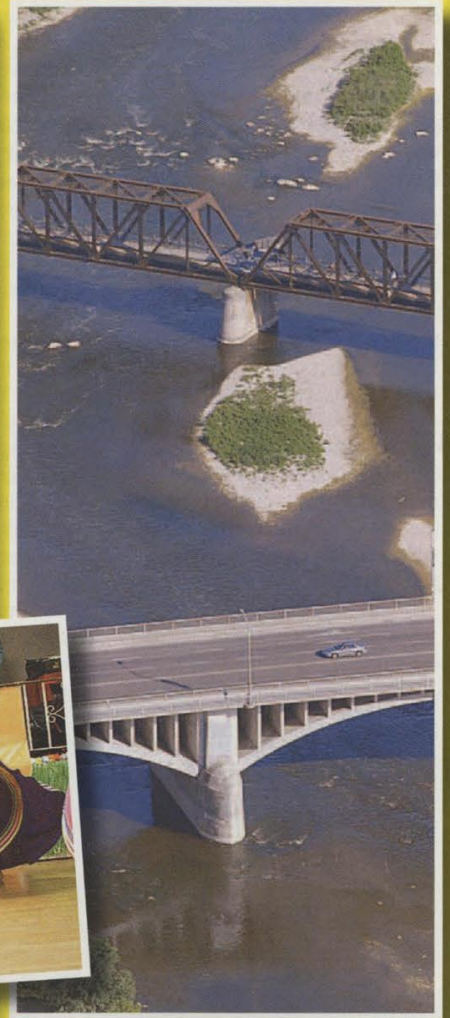

RiverView Terrace is a beautiful heritage building. A few years ago, RiverView won a heritage restoration award from the City of Brantford. Although the front entrance is part of a Brantford heritage building, built in 1871, RiverView is fully compliant with every modern convenience. Two elevators, common area air-conditioning, room air conditioning as required (not everyone wants it) and hotel style telephones are in every room and bathroom. All telephones are

directly linked to nurses who carrying cell phones. Fully carpeted throughout for softness and beauty. The dining room is elegant, and the food is wholesome, well presented and delicious.

Physical Security

Security is both physical and operational. First of all, there are physical issues. RiverView has state of the art fire and life safety systems including: sprinklers, smoke and heat detectors, two elevators, telephone links to nursing in all bedrooms and bathrooms. And, security cameras in selected locations. Also, the staff ensure that the building is locked and properly lit at appropriate times. Rounds are at prescribed intervals to minimize risk.

In addition RiverView has "easy swing doors" for each suite to ensure comfort and safety.

Nursing or Retirement Home?

What's the difference? Most don't know the difference. After all, they both have nurses around the clock, prepare meals and snacks, all housekeeping is provided, the doctor comes to both. They both have activity programs and administer medications, baths, etc.

But, nursing homes have a much more intensive nursing program, because in general, the residents are not as well. Since the changes in legislation, nursing homes are not significantly cheaper than retirement homes. RiverView does not offer as much physical care as a nursing home – but more individual care is available if you need it.
