Q. How high is the plot of shrubs where the alleged offence took place with respect to your height. A. I would not give an estimate.

Couple Seen on Street

George N. Gorman, witness called, gave his residence at the Marshall apartments directly across the road from the Faulkner residence. He stated that with his wife he attended the first show at the picture Theatre and was returning home shortly before nine thirty. He stated he walked on the north side of Bridge Street and near the residence of Dr. Marshall noticed a man and woman walking west on Bridge Street.

Q. Where were they? A. Near the Reid residence.

Q. Where did they go? A. They were walking quite quickly with the man on the inside. The woman was dressed in dark clothes and the man was wearing a "light colored" overcoat. When they reached the Faulkner residence they cut the corner and went onto the Faulkner lawn and were lost to my view because it was quite dark.

Q. What next happened? A. We had reached the driveway of the Marshall apartment, when I heard a "groan". I started across the road, when I saw a car approaching from the west and stopping the car, and knowing the occupants we went towards the surgery door of Dr. Faulkner. I saw a bundle of clothing on the lawn. Mr. Burrows struck some matches and we noticed a woman.

Justice Jeffrey—Was it dark? A. Very.

Q. What was her condition? A. Her hair was disheveled, there was much blood on her face and her teeth were protruding from her mouth. It was a ghastly sight.

Q. How is the light on the pole? A. The pole is between light and the Faulkner residence.

Q. Was the light over the surgery door lit? A. No.

Q. What did you do? A. I went to telephone and when I came back Mrs. (Dr.) Faulkner was present.

Mrs. Faulkner telephoned for a physician and Dr. Gibson answered. At that time Mrs. Faulkner did not know it was her mother. The woman was carried into the surgery, and then Mrs. Faulkner said "It is my mother."

Q. Did you see any instrument? A. Yes a hatchet. Officer Isard had the hatchet but I did not touch it.

Jurors' Meals

When lunch adjournment was street

reached today in the trial of Harold W. Vermilyea, charged with the murder of his mother, Sheriff J. D. O'Flynn announced to Mr. Justice Nicol Jeffrey the jurors would be eating in the court house.

His Lordship would not countenance the arrangement and said the jurors had to be comfortable and segregated during the trial. He said they must be taken to a hotel where a private dining room would be available.

Gorman Cross-Examined

Called to the stand at the resumption of the Court at 2.35 this (Wednesday) afternoon, Mr. Gorman was cross-examined by Col. Greer.

Q.—Do you think this couple could have seen you? A.—Certainly.

Q.—Nothing particular about them? A.—Only that they were walking quickly.

Q.—How many were on the street at the time? A.—They were the only ones I noticed.

Q.—Did you ever hear a voice. A.—No.

Q.—From the time you saw the couple turn in until you heard the groan, the time was short? A.—Yes. Just a little time.

Q.—As a layman the injuries to Mrs. Vermilyea were bad? A.—It was a shocking sight.

Mr. G. B. Smith, one of the occupants of the car stopped by Mr. Gorman was the next witness and recounted his knowledge of the offence.

His evidence in the main was the same as the former witness.

Q. After you were stopped was there a conversation? A. Yes and I followed Mr. Gorman and Mr. Burrows up the walk. Near the surgery door I noticed a body lying a few feet easterly from the walk. I was quite close before I noticed the body.

Q. How was it that you could not see the body until close to it? A. Because it was quite dark. I went to the car to get a flashlight and putting my hand underneath the body, I raised it and recognized it to be a woman.

Q. In the light of the flashlight how did you not know it was Mrs. Vermilyea? A. Her hair was down over her face and there was considerable blood on the face.

Q. How strong are the lights? A. 100 candle power.

Q. Are they good lights? A. I would not say so for that type of
