For example, training could be taken by an employer or employee who needs to learn a new software package for work but can't find the time at the office. Komputech may enlist the help of outside people for these courses or may teach them themselves. Komputech currently employs four full-time and two parttime employees. Since its inception in 1984 it has increased its gross sales from \$35,000 the first year to \$800,000.
