

opment of a pleasure park at Massassauga Point. He also established Corby Charitable Fund for the Poor and Needy, a project still administered by the Women's Christian Association.

According to files from the Hastings County Historical Society, Corby Jr. lived in his George Street home with his wife, Maria Courtney, and three daughters. While on a trip to Bermuda, he died of appendicitis on April 24, 1917. It is not known who, among Corby's relatives, lived in his old home following his death, but before the demolition took place, the house had been vacant for some years. An apartment building was built in its place.

Today, the memory of this generous resident lives on amidst the fragrance of the roses at Corby Park in the summer and in the appreciative hearts of the local book lovers visiting the local public library.
