Marc, you mentioned the called-back goal by referee Andy Van Hellemond in that crucial Game 3 loss. It was glaringly obvious that Ranger forward Alexei Kovalev faked an injury behind the play to negate that goal. The officiating was questionable on several other occasions in your series and the others. Do you think NHL officiating is as bad as it seems?

"No, I believe we have the best officiating in the world, These guys have a very tough job. There are going to be tough calls, we had four (TV) networks doing our games, there's going to be a whole lot of commentary. I think they take an undo amount of abuse. We have to protect our officiating a little bit more.'

There appear to be prob-lems, however. How would you address them?

"I don't think, as a league, we've identified the problem real well. In our series the problem was diving and the unbelievably quick recuperation (of the divers). That should be addressed, it shouldn't be a determining factor.

What's the answer?

"First and foremost, they have the diving rule in affect and they don't call it. If they call it early in the game, guys will think twice about it. I think the other thing is if players are injured and if the result is an expulsion for a game, then that (injured) player shouldn't be allowed to participate in the power play. It's not my job to evaluate officiating, those are just a couple of areas they can look at. It's a good game, we don't want to tinker with it too much.'

Is increased use of video replay one possible solution?

"I don't think you can do that. It's good for goals but it shouldn't be in place for anything else. There is too much focus on them when there's a blown call rather than on guys like Kovalev and (Nick) Kypreos when they're diving all over the place."
