Following the singing of the last hymn, to the strains of the Dead March in Saul, all that was mortal of the late Miss Ella Gardiner, was conveyed from the church she loved and served so well and faithfully.

The Rev. (Dr.) E. N. Baker, assisted by the Rev. (Dr.) Charles Bishop conducted the committal in the Belleville cemetery.
