

Greenfield: Howard M

M. EDWARD GREENFIELD

Prominent member of the staff of the Northern Electric Company here, M. Edward Greenfield passed away in Belleville General Hospital, on Monday, September 26, 1955. He was in his 53rd year.

Born in Manchester, England, Mr. Greenfield was the only son of Mrs. Janet Greenfield and the late Edward Greenfield. He was one of a family of five. He had been ill for some time prior to his demise.

Mr. Greenfield came to Canada, when he was five years of age. He became associated with the Northern Electric Company some twenty years later in Montreal. He was transferred to Belleville when the company moved its electronics plant here eight years ago. His initiative and adaptability soon earned him promotion and he was named assistant to the purchasing agent in an advisory capacity.

Mr. Greenfield was a popular figure in the many spheres of activity in which he moved. A sportsman he favored bowling and was associated with the Major "A" league here for years. Possessed of an amiable personality and the ability to make friends easily Mr. Greenfield will be missed not only among his industrial associates but many friends in the city and in Montreal.

He was a member of the Bell Telephone Company Pioneers and of St. Michael's church. He had been associated with Northern Electric for the past 27 years and two years ago was presented with his twenty-five year service symbol.

Surviving besides, Mrs. Greenfield, the former Doris Stutely, are one son, Edward J., Belleville; one daughter, Doris Janet Elizabeth at home, and four sisters, Mrs. Margaret Alcock, Mrs. Alice Borden, Mrs. Grace Taylor and Mrs. Edith Davies, all of Montreal.
