One of the guests brought an old photograph from Mount Carmel School and the centenarian proved that his mind is still clear. He was able to identify several of his former schoolmates.

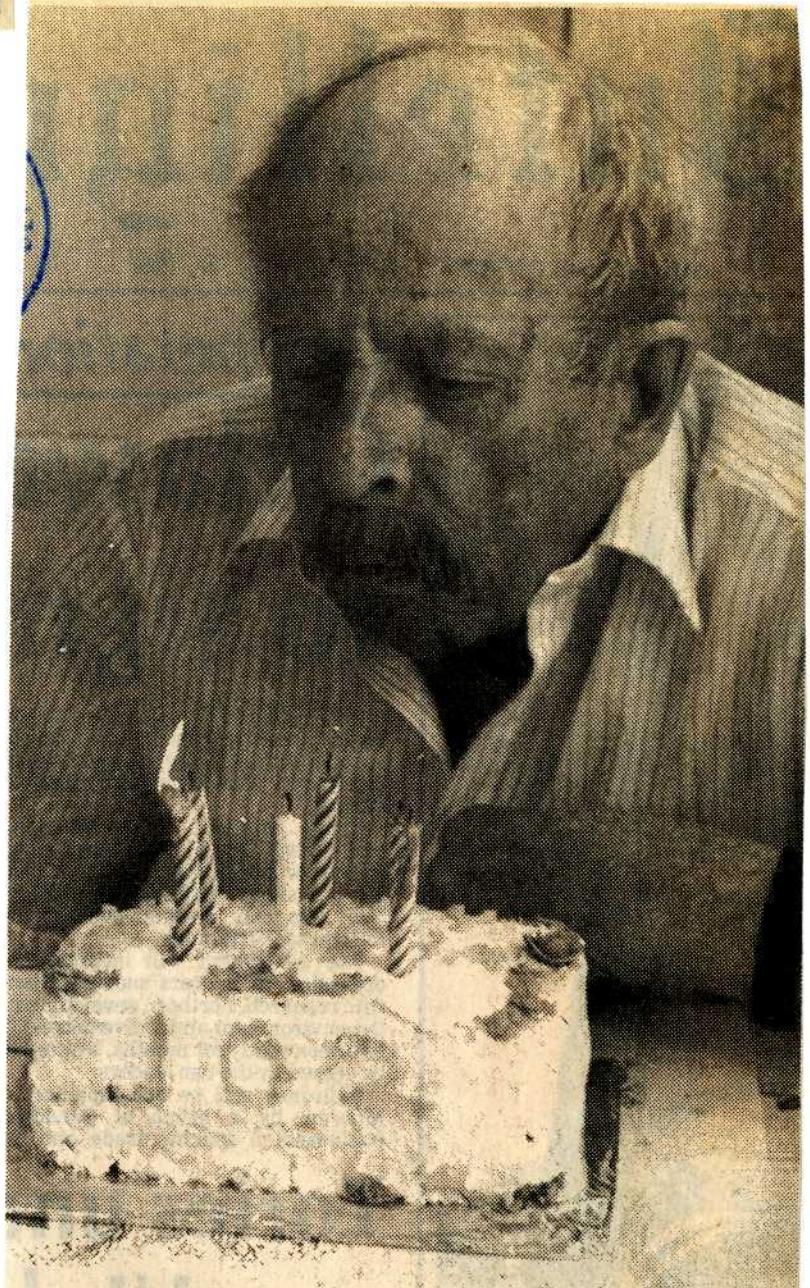
Although he doesn't get around much any more, he says he still enjoys watching television and particularly enjoys watching hockey games.
