He was also a member of the Ontario Amateur Softball Association for many years and, at the time of his death, was an executive member of the OASA and a member of the OASA rules committee and director of the Slow Pitch program for the OASA.

Tebby's involvement in softball also extended to umpiring, having long been a member of the Quinte Umpires Association as well as convening OASA final series in eastern Ontario.

"We're all sorry that he's gone," Cliff Belch, past president of the OASA and current recreation director for the City of Belleville, said this morning.
