French troops gun down war crimes suspect

SARAJEVO (Reuters) — French troops shot Bosnian-Serb war crimes suspect Dragan Gagovic dead Saturday after he tried to run them down in his car during an attempt to arrest him.

The fatal shooting sparked an angry protest, involving about 100 people, outside the office of the UN policing mission in the eastern Bosnian town Foca. Two staff members were injured during the demonstration, prompting the evacuation of the office, a UN spokeswoman said.

Soldiers from the NATO Stabilization Force opened fire on Gagovic's car during a planned detention operation near Foca, NATO spokesman Glenn Chamberlain said. The French Defence Ministry in Paris later confirmed the troops involved were French.

Several other people in the car with Gagovic were not seriously hurt in the incident and were cared for by French military medical personnel. Chamberlain said the passengers were children and teenagers.

The French ministry said in a statement a doctor was present at the time of the shooting and noted Gagovic died instantly.

Chamberlain said the incident was unfortunate but unavoidable and the soldiers were acting in self-defence.
