## A soldier is given a new order Hasty P captain for invested as member

## of Order of Canada

"It was an exciting experience," sums up Belleville's Capt. Bill Vallance after he was formally invested as a member of the Order of Canada at Rideau Hall by Gov. Gen. Jeanne Sauve.
