What's the secret of longevity? Nellie Hutcheon of Stirling, who celebrated her 100th birthday on July 2, says it's "leading a quiet life and the grace of the Lord."

She served an apprenshe served an apprenticeship in millinery at a shop in Stirling, and worked for a doctor in Toronto during the 1890's, often driving the doctor on his

rounds in a buggy or cutter.
She married William
Hutcheon, a farmer in
Seymour Township, in 1901. The couple celebrated their golden wedding anniversary in 1951, in the same farmhouse they lived in when they were first married.

A loyal church-goer, Mrs. Hutcheon was a member of Burnbrae Presbyterian Church, and taught Sunday School there for over 40 years, one of her fondest memories, she

Mrs. Hutcheon lives at Towers Nursing Home in Stirling, and administrator Jack Duffill says she often enjoys reminiscing about her long life.

"I remember asking her what they did in the winters before there were snow plows. She said they didn't bother much during the week, but to clear a path on the weekend, all the men would line up down the road and shovel it out by hand," says head nurse Nancy Bridges.

Mrs. Hutcheon says she enjoyed working the farm right alongside her husband.

Evenings were quietwe'd just spend time with the family, and go to bed at nine o'clock," she said.

She used to belong to a church choir, and says she still loves to listen to music.

"It,s incredible...at the church services; she can remember all the verses of the hymns, even if there are five or six, said nurse Bridges.

She received a com-memorative plaque from Ontario Premier William Davis when she reached her 99th birthday last year. About 125 friends and relatives, including her sons Howard and Malcolm, of Stirling, their wives, five grandchildren, and nine great-grandchildren, helped her celebrate her looth birthday.
