A Belleville man has received the highest award presented by the Canadian Institute of Management.

Ron Jones was recently presented with the 500 Club Merit Award at the institute's bi-regional meeting in Toronto.

The award recognizes years of dedication by rendering voluntary services for specific areas of the institute's operations.

Jones completed his CIM training in the early 1980s and was a director of the Quinte branch. In 1986 he received his CIM designation and his Professional Manager designation. Jones was branch president be-

tween 1987 and 1989, and then was Ontario East Region president, a position he still holds.
