K.J. Macdonald New Manager Scotiabank Here

The Bank of Nova Scotia announces the appointment of Mr. K. J. Macdonald as manager of its branch here in Belleville, succeeding Mr. G. L. Tripp, who returns to his old stamping-ground at Arnprior.

Ken Macdonald joined the bank in his native town of Bridgen, near Sarnia, in 1935. As it happened, all of his succeeding Scotiabank positions have been in Northern Ontario. His wife, Hazel, hails from Peterborough, so both the Macdonalds are looking forward to life in the milder climate and beautiful surroundings of the Quinte area.

During World War II Mr. Macdonald served for four and one-half years with the Signal Corps, Armored Corp, Infantry, rising from the rank of private to commissioned officer. Returning to the bank, he worked at Parry Sound, Bracebridge and Sudbury, where he was appointed accountant. Next came the position of manager at Penetang and Haileybury, from where he comes to Belleville.

In his various locations he has been active in the work of the Chamber of Commerce, the Canadian Legion, Rotary Club and similar community organizations. There are five young Macdonalds: Sally, who is 15, and her four younger brothers, Bob, Don, John and David.
