Economist honored

The memory of a Canadian home economist, widely-known in the Quinte district where she lived many years, is being honored by area colleagues.

Dorothy Batchelor McKinnon, a national personality in home economics—she was a life member of the Canadian Home Economics Association—died a year ago.

Now, the Quinte Home Economics Association has instituted a lecture in her name, city council was told by the organization Tuesday.

Emanuel Farber, chairman of University of Toronto's pathology department, will deliver the first Lecture June 11 at Centennial Secondary School Auditorium, starting at 7.30 p.m.

It's also a move toward the association's goal of providing information to Quinte area families and individuals.

Prof. Farber's lecture will view the developing perspective of nutrition and cancer.
