J. K. Bradford, founding president of Loyalist College in Belleville, has been appointed to a new position with the Alberta Department of Education.

The former local college president will act as director of the Old Sun School on the Blackfoot reserve at Gleichen, Alta and has already assumed his new position.

The school is a satellite of the Mount Royal Junior Community College in Calgary which will open in September to help Indians acquire home and work skills and general education.

Mr. Bradford was appointed president of Loyalist Col-

lege in 1967 and served in that capacity until he retired last year.

During his tenure as president he steered the college from its small beginnings in rented quarters at Centennial secondary School and was largely responsible for its current development.

At the time of his retirement, board president Frank Rabel said Mr. Bradford's service throughout the initial years of the college had made its current accomplishment possible.

Mr. and Mrs. Bradford still have their home in Belleville but are making arrangements shortly to move to Alberta.
