

# Maj. Bradford honored for work

Belleville native Maj. Robert Bradford — an army general staff officer with the Canadian Navy Division Headquarters in Kingston — has been awarded the Maritime Commander's Commendation for outstanding performance, dedication and professionalism in his work.

Bradford, son of Jack and Kay Bradford of Belleville, was given the award by Canadian Navy Commander Admiral Gary Barnett in a ceremony in Halifax June 30.

A graduate of Nicholson Catholic College, Bradford was assigned to Maritime Command and Maritime Forces Atlantic in 1994 as a liaison office for navy-army matters. On his arrival, he also assumed the duties of a joint operations office for navy-army and amphibious operations.

During his term with the navy, Bradford was a principal planner for the annual joint maritime exercises, co-ordinated joint navy-army training, and conducted research in amphibious operations which involved participation in courses and operational exercises with

British and American amphibious forces.

He returns to Belleville this summer prior to taking up a position in the education field in Calgary. He will remain an advisor for joint operations to Maritime Forces Atlantic as a reservist.
