Herbert McCabe Dies Suddenly At Hunting Camp in North

Belleville - big
Long a public figure in the Belleville area and operator of the Bay of Quinte Fisheries for a quarter of a century, Mr. Herbert McCabe, 260 Bleecker Ave., died suddenly yesterday at his Weslemkoon Lake area hunting camp.

Death was believed to have been the result of a heart attack. The hunting camp was at Noisy Lake.

Born at Hay Bay, Mr. McCabe was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. William T. McCabe and had lived practically all his life in the Belleville area.

A lifetime sportsman, he had hunted deer for more than 55 years. He was a member of the Belleville Fish and Game Club and was a director of the Eastern Ontario Fisherman's Asso-

ciation. He was a former member of the Belleville Harbor Commission and a one time game warden for the Belleville area.

A staunch Liberal, he was past president of the Belleville Liberal Association, and also the Hastings South Liberal Association. He was an adherent of Bridge Street United Church.

He is survived by his wife, the former Effie Matthews, one son Ralph, of Toronto and three daughters, Mrs. Jack (Jean)
