# Police Constable Dies on Holiday

While vacationing at Bob's Lake in north Hastings County, Lorne Frederick McLinton, R.R. 4 Belleville, a member of the traffic department of the Belleville Police Department, died suddenly from a heart attack on Thursday. He was in his 35th year. excellent officer and well respected by everyone."

He joined the police force, 11 years ago, went immediately into the traffic department, and was detailed to motorcycle duty until last year.
