## Fellowship Is Awarded Local Man

J. Thomas McMullen of 14
Parker Street, Belleville, has been awarded one of the ten R. Samuel McLaughlin Resident Fellowships valued at \$3,600 Queen's University announced today. The Fellowship is tenable for two years and will enable Mr. McMullen to proceed with research he began two years ago at Queen's, which will lead to the degree of Doctor of Philosophy in Physical Chemistry.

The son of Dr. and Mrs. Thomas McMullen, he graduated from Albert College in 1960 and received the degree of Bachelor of Science with first class honors from Queen's in 1964. At that time Mr. McMullen received the university medal in chemistry and the Golden Key of Merit, given by the Canadian section of the Society of Chemical Industry to the student making the highest standing in his final year in the honor course in chemistry. He was also awarded a \$2,000 bursary and a \$1,000 National Research Council summer supplement.

Mr. McMullen, 24, proceeded directly to the doctorate, skipping the master's degree, and expects to receive the PhD within 2 years.
