The honors just keep rolling in for Belleville native Rick Meagher, captain of St. Louis Blues of the National Hockey League.

The speedy Meagher has stretch-


ed his excellent skating ability into a key role with the Blues as a defensive specialist assigned to the opponent's top centre.

In his five seasons with St. Louis, Meagher has been assigned the likes of Wayne Gretzky, Mario Lemieux. Steve Yzerman and Denis Savard.

This past season he totalled eight goals and 17 assists for 25 points and only 47 minutes in penalites. His plus-minus rating was four, an excellent figure considering who he covers game in and game out.

Meagher also runs the successful Rick Meagher Benefit Golf Tournament, which is heading into its third year.

A graduate of Quinte Secondary School, Meagher played minor hockey in the Belleville Minor Hockey Association and the Belleville Bobcats junior B's before attending Boston University. He got his professional start with Mon-
