PICTON - Mildred Naylor, a resident of the H.J. McFarland Home for the Aged will celebrate her 99th birthday, Wednesday, but, like most women, she is a bit absent minded about the occasion.

"When we mentioned that her birthday was coming up, she didn't remember for a minute. Then she said 'Why I guess it is,'" said her son, Gordon Naylor, of RR 2, Picton.

A resident of the McFarland Home for approximately three years, Mrs. Naylor has spent her entire life in Prince Edward County, with the exception of an 11-year period when she and her

husband, Alston, lived on a farm in Saskatchewan.

Born at Mount Carmel in Sophiasburg township, she is a descendant of Benjamin Rowe, pioneer of the Rowe family in Prince Edward County.

Mrs. Naylor is a granddaughter of James Rowe, son of Benjamin Rowe, and his wife, Mary Potter. Her father, Jay Rowe, donated land for a church and a school at Mount Carmel.

Widowed in 1969, Mrs. Naylor has one child, a son, Gordon. The old Rowe homestead in which she was born is still standing and is now owned by Fred Campbell.
