Parker selected to replace Haider

A professional management consultant will fill the vacancy on the Belleville Police Services Board.

Monday it was announced Ted Parker, 62, has been approved by the provincial cabinet as the third appointee to the board.

The board has three provincial appointees and two representatives of the city but was working shorthanded when the province didn't reappoint Dawn Haider earlier this year.

Parker says he doesn't know who nominated him for the position but he told the Ministry of the Solicitor General he would serve if appointed.

"I'm interested in the inner workings of policing. I want to see if the police are being treated fairly and if in turn they are treating the public fairly," he says.

Parker retired from Ontario Hydro after 26 years service in April, 1992 and before that served 15 years in the Royal Canadian Air Force. He now owns his own management consulting company, T.P. Management Studies.

A member of St. Thomas Anglican Church, where he's been a warden in the past, he's also involved in the Masonic Lodge and was a volunteer with the Belleville Minor Hockey Association in the late 1970s.

Parker's term is for two years.
