Dear Mrs. Sudgeon:

Your letter addressed to Providence was forwarded to me here where I am now living.

I am glad to tell you what I can about the Van Horneman family. My eldest brother, Herbert, was interested in our genealogy and made notes on what he learned. He died in 1938 before he had finished getting them in proper form. If you come sometime to Boston I shall be glad to let you see them. In the meantime, perhaps you can find something new to you from these notes.

1. Joseph Van Horneman was born in Holland in 1729, died in Canandaigua, N. Y. in 1817. He had eleven children, among them a Daniel, who lived

north of Batavia, N. Y. at 1 Holland's Purchase. He had two sons, Joseph and Samuel.

1. Joseph had also a son Isaac, who in turn had a son Joseph.
2. Ephraim, Joseph's eldest son, ~~married~~ married a Miss Morgan and they lived in Nelson, near Hamilton, Ont.
3. Ephraim's children were Isaac, Jacob, Abram Joseph and Ruth.
4. Joseph's son John b. 1765, d. 1830, Normandale.
5. John lived in Sussex County, New Jersey where he had a grist mill. He married Sarah De Pau (or D'Pay or De Pui) who also died in Normandale. Their children were:
