Rev. C. Wright officiated at the ceremony during which Ruth Lawrence played the wedding music and Mrs. E. Trinton gave the solo.

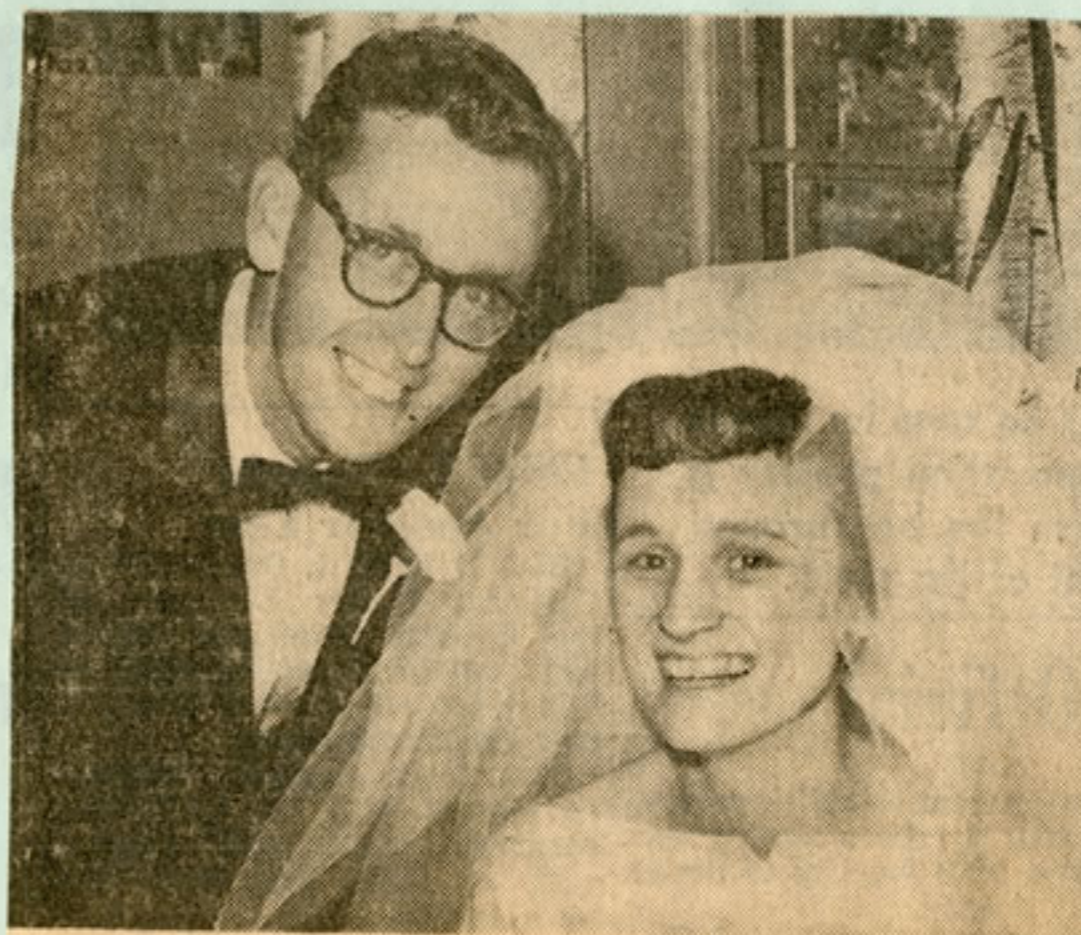
Following a reception at the Royal Hamilton Yacht Club, the newly-
