He came to Holy Rosary in 1953. For the past three years he has been chairmanof the local separate school board, of which he has been a member since amalgamation. Under his guidance, Cathedral High School expanded double. He still serves on the board of governors. He is an enthusiastic golfer and curler belonging to Burlington Golf and Curling Club.
