Dr.C.W.Booth, deputy minister of education, will be speaker for the official opening of the new \$1,245,000 Aldershot High School, scheduled for 8 p.m. November 20th.

A.Roy Coulter, chairman of the Board of Education, will preside.

Dedication ceremonies, will be conducted by the Rev. Blake J.Ryan, pastor of Holy Rosary Roman Catholic Church, and the Rev. William Black, minister of Aldershot Presbyterian Church.

The school, which opened for classes in September, now has an enrolment of 415. Courses are only being offered this term in grades nine, 10 and 11. Two hundred and forty students in the Aldershot area will continue to attend Waterdown District High School.

The easterly portion of the Aldershot School is a two-storey classroom wing with 14 standard classrooms, a library classroom, art room, two laboratories, home economics rooms and industrial art shop.
