1926 - September receipts show an entry of \$119.00 received from Aldershot Hockey Club, which used the greens during the winter months. A small building and benches affording shelter and ease of changing skates. R.H.Emery was treasurer for the Hockey Club.

Apparently no minutes were kept of meetings during the years 1923 to 1930; just a record of receipts and expenses.

Owing to increased membership and need for more greens, it was decided to locate on Shade-land Avenue, on land made available by George D. Filman, and in October of 1930 a drive was made to raise funds to build a new Club House.

John McBride is mentioned for laying out greens on the new property.
