in March 1944. He was in action on D-Day and fought in many of the early battles, including the battle of the Arden River, up until July 18th.

While in a wheat field below Caen he sustained severe injuries to both loss but in spite of these.

to both legs, but in spite of these wounds, he managed to crawl for some distance until he met tank of his own unit. To escape bein hit by these he stuck his helms on a bayonet and so attracted the attention of rescue workers, who administered first aid.

Pte. Griffin reached Englan

July 23 and remained in the hospital until he was ready to return to Canada. On Nov. 15th he arrived at Christie St. Hospital, To ronto, and was met by his parent and sister Lottie. He has been released for six weeks and is a present in West Guilford.
