Hockey players from the past, in the audience included the chairman Dr. Jim Fawcett; Elwood "Sixty" Coombs Jr., Joe Jenkins who was a school teacher in Mariposa Township as a young man, and played hockey; Howard Williamson, a goalkeeper at the L.C.I.; Glen Hodgson, who played minor hockey in Haliburton,

Bert Hick, hockeyist, who became president of the Ontario Minor Hockey Association; Reeve Roy Morrison, who played with Oakwood teams in his youth; Bill Cummins, at one time the fastest miler in Toronto, Norm Ruslman of the old Windsor Monarchs; Bob Magahey, who recalled to Syl Apps a game between New York Rangers and Toronto Maple Leafs, when Dave Pratt of the Rangers used the word "yellow" and received in return a stern blow to the chin from Apps, which settled all arguments. It was Ralph Wakelin however who Apps remembered best, as Ralph was detailed to check Apps when the pair played on opposite teams at St. Thomas, Apps playing for the Army, and Wakelin for the Air Force.
