

INSIDE VICKSBURG.

A copy of the Vicksburg Citizen, of 12th July, has been received here. It is about eighteen by twenty-four inches, and is printed on a high quality of wall paper. We append an extract from it.

We have at length got a little light from the outside world. We, who have been circumscribed and cut off from our usual morning supplies of exchanges since the 16th of May, are once more enabled to peruse a newspaper. Several copies of that familiar Mercury of Intelligence (the Mississippiian) its office of bringing us the commissions of the days when the morning train brought in regularly the printed dailies of our sister city of Jackson—days are the fortunes of war surrounded our homes with hissing bayonets and black throated cannon, throwing their angry and deadly projectiles hither and thither through our city. The Mississippiian has been "cut off" of its fair proportions, and is now about the size of our old half sheet.

We have fastened on the contents of the copies before us—have read with pleasure, and with pride the cheerful spirit of the people of the Confederacy relative to the situation at Vicksburg. The utmost confidence is felt in our ability to maintain our position until success reaches us from the outside. Everywhere we are talked of, and eulogiums heaped upon the heads of the more than Spartan band that have been keeping incessant vigil along our line of intrenchments since the 18th of May. There seems to be no cracking outside. All is hope and cheer, with the people, and with the Government an unflinching determination to extricate us at an early day as possible from our present perilous and decidedly unpleasant position.

We would say to our people—some of whom we are glad to hope deferred maketh the heart sick—and to our soldiers, ye, those gallant soldiers who have stood between our city and the foe like a wall of fire for twenty-six days exposed to the burning sun—in the heat of the day, the day of our deliverance is not far off. See many signs and set, the muttering of the cannon and musket will be heard from the outside, announcing that the invincible host, marshalled by the undaunted Johnston is close at hand. We are to be relieved. We will be free again, and Vicksburg's name will stand higher than ever before, and her name will be a name of glory, and her name will be a name of glory, and her name will be a name of glory.

Yesterday the capital, so staid and quiet during the excitement of the past three weeks, fell suddenly into a most unaccountable panic, caused by flying rumors, correspondents and civilians rushing into the city at break-neck speed, with hats and hair streaming in the wind, and looking more like pictures of the Flying Dutchman than anything else in the shape of reality. What did it all mean?—a thousand anxious inquirers asked, while three times that number as quickly answered—"Let's entire army is advancing. They are but a few miles out of Georgetown, where they have captured our wagon trains, horses, and several hundred prisoners."

During the evening the crowds in the streets and hotels manufactured fresh sensations. The railroad was cut a dozen times, by rumor, between here and Baltimore, and Washington columns had been ordered for high treason, and General Hooker had declared he would not fight Lee, so he had been removed! Old men with grey hairs who looked wise, were as excited as some of the cavalrymen, who, notwithstanding they had not been within miles of the disaster, stood up in the presence of the angry and hot crowds and gave minute details of the whole affair. Mealy has often done as bold things before this, and nearer to Washington, too, for he was down to the Chain bridge, not four miles distant, on Saturday last.

The fears of a cavalry raid between here and Baltimore are somewhat subsiding. Nightly over-land expeditions to find the rebels isolated today, but the wires are working and the trains run regularly. After today it will be too late for any raid. Nothing can be gleaned from the situation showing the imminence of battle. Lee is still in the horse-shoe valley and beyond. If we have a battle he will be in the valley and over the South Mountain range, which he certainly don't intend to do, but is waiting for Gen. Meade's army to come after him. We shall see. The result ensues in any event the safety of Washington and Baltimore.

PANIC IN WASHINGTON.

The raid of the Confederate cavalry across the Potomac into the District of Columbia, produced quite a panic in Washington. The correspondent of the Commercial Advertiser thus describes it. He says, under date of the 30th—

Yesterday the capital, so staid and quiet during the excitement of the past three weeks, fell suddenly into a most unaccountable panic, caused by flying rumors, correspondents and civilians rushing into the city at break-neck speed, with hats and hair streaming in the wind, and looking more like pictures of the Flying Dutchman than anything else in the shape of reality. What did it all mean?—a thousand anxious inquirers asked, while three times that number as quickly answered—"Let's entire army is advancing. They are but a few miles out of Georgetown, where they have captured our wagon trains, horses, and several hundred prisoners."

During the evening the crowds in the streets and hotels manufactured fresh sensations. The railroad was cut a dozen times, by rumor, between here and Baltimore, and Washington columns had been ordered for high treason, and General Hooker had declared he would not fight Lee, so he had been removed! Old men with grey hairs who looked wise, were as excited as some of the cavalrymen, who, notwithstanding they had not been within miles of the disaster, stood up in the presence of the angry and hot crowds and gave minute details of the whole affair. Mealy has often done as bold things before this, and nearer to Washington, too, for he was down to the Chain bridge, not four miles distant, on Saturday last.

The fears of a cavalry raid between here and Baltimore are somewhat subsiding. Nightly over-land expeditions to find the rebels isolated today, but the wires are working and the trains run regularly. After today it will be too late for any raid. Nothing can be gleaned from the situation showing the imminence of battle. Lee is still in the horse-shoe valley and beyond. If we have a battle he will be in the valley and over the South Mountain range, which he certainly don't intend to do, but is waiting for Gen. Meade's army to come after him. We shall see. The result ensues in any event the safety of Washington and Baltimore.
