The following very sensible and temperate view of tobacco-using will, we hope, commend itself to sensible young men who have unfortunately contracted the habit; but who are not yet unable to abandon the dangerous weed. The comments are those of Henry Ward Beecher, and are well worth careful consideration:—

"I must be permitted to specialize still another danger from the general head of dissipation—one that you are not accustomed to hear spoken of in the pulpit. I mean the danger of using tobacco. Do not think that I purpose to deliver an indiscriminate tirade of abuse against this practice. I wish to speak mederately, and to give the result of my reflections founded upon much observation.

"I do not deny that there are many temperaments that seem to be able to use tobac-co all their life long with comparatively little inconvenience—to themselves. 1 do not mean that every young man who addicts himself to chewing or smoking will of necessity take on other vices, or let this habit run to fexcess. But we are a nervous people. Everything in the economy of our so-ciety tends to develope the brain and the nervous system unduly. Now, as a matter of fact, it is true that among such a people smoking is apt to lead to thirst and drinking. Not always, not necessarily; but frequently and naturally. The cup and the cigar are well acquainted with each other.

"The use of tobacco always tends to waste the nervous -force and the brain-force; and in thousands of cases there can be no question but that it squanders life by leakage poisoned and prematurely destroyed, or not. his visits as usual, viz: on the first Thursday in each month and remain one week, when he there might be some excuse for those that include in it; but it is a thing which is entirely without any reason whatever. You have to make superhuman exertions, in the first instance, to persuade yourself to touch tobacco. It would seem as il God, when he made that weed, said, 'I invoke all spirits of nausea and nastiness to stand around about and defend it from any touch.' For it seems its use is, in the main, illusive pleasure. And such is the effect of it as a poison upon many constitutions, that the struggle of breaking away from it is next only to the struggle of breaking away from the cup. And it has led many and many a youth to the cup. If you have but just began to smoke ask yourselves what earth!y good it will do you; and if you fail, as you will, to find a good excuse for continuing the habit, leave it off. If you chew and smoke, your misery is double; and if you do but one, do not try
to cure yourselves by doing the other, for
you will end in doing both. On grounds of
simple common sense, I ask every young
man in this congregation who is addicted to the unwholesome practice of smoking or chewing, is it worth your while to spend your means, and entail upon yourselves an and stables. innecessary expense for the sake of keeping up a habit that incommodes others, that annoys those about you, that will probably have a bad influence upon your health, and that will possibly injure your morals? While I would not seem to be extravagant, I cannot fail to give a solemn and affectionate warning to the young people of my charge on this subject. If you have not learned to use tobacco in any form, I beseech you abstain from it. The young often acquire the habit because they feel that it will be a discommon that it is not a distinction. If you wish to have a distinction, refrain from smoking; that will make you rather remarhable."

FIRES IN BEDROOMS.

Most people, even many intelligent reformers, have the idea that to sleep in a cold room is good—essential to health. This is an error. It is better to have a fire in your bed-room. The atmosphere is by this means not only constantly changed, but with the fire you will keep the window open, which will add greatly to the needed ventilation.
But more than this, with the fire you will have fewer bedclothes over you, which is a gain, as a large number of blankets not only interfere somewhat with the circulation and respiration, but prevents the escape of those gases which the skin is constantly emitting. Even furnace or stove heat with an open window is better than a close, cold room. Interchange with the external atmosphere depends upon the difference of the temperature of the air within and without. But let us have the open fire. Let us go without silks, broadcloths, carpets, and finery of all kinds, if necessary, that we may have this beautiful purifier and diffuser of joy in all our houses. In my own house I have ten open grates, and find that with ecal at eleven doilars the expense is frightful, and if it were in any other department of housekeeping I should feel I could not afford it; but in this I do not flinch, so important do I deem the open fire.—Dr. Lewis

ERNEST KISS.

One of the most distinguished of the Hungarian generals who were taken prisoners and executed by the Austrians, had the singular name of Ernest Kiss. He was a wealthy proprietor, owning twenty-three villages, and was a man of excessive personal elegance as well as of chivalric courage. He regularly sent his linen all the way from Hungary to Paris to be washed, and was, in similar respects, a D'Orsay as well as a Bayard. His coolness in danger was remarkable; and it is told of him that one day within reach of an Austrian battery, making an observation, he ordered his servant to bring him a cup of chocolate. A shot took it from his hand and killed his horse. -"Clumsy rascals," said Kiss, "they have upset my breaklast." When taken out with three others to be shot, he was superbly Lindsay, May 5, 1864. dressed. The order was given to fire, and his companions fell, while he stood untouched. "You have forgotten me," said Kiss, in his usual tone of voice. The corporal of the platoon stepped up and fired, and the ball striking him on the forehead, he fe'l dead without a struggle.
