By-Law No. 101

A By-Law to provide for the Assessment of Statute Labor within the Municipality of Lindsay, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Municipal Corporation of the Town of Lindsay, and it is hereby

. That from and after the passing of this By-Law, all property liable to be assessed for Statute Labor shall be assessed for the the same according to the scale hereunder,

For all and every assessment of a fental value of \$24, and under - 2 days
Over \$24 and not more than \$36, - 3 days Over 36 Over 48 Over 72 " 96, - - 6 days " 120, - - 8 days " 144, - - 8 days " 192, - - 9 days 242. - - 11 days and for every additional \$48 rental value, one day Statute labor to be added.

That the commutation for statute labor shall be Fifty cents per day, if paid to the Treasurer of this Municipality on or before the first day of June, in each year.
 That the Treasurer be required fo receive all moneys tendered as commutation of sta-

tute labor, at the rate per day before mentioned, and that he do also keep a separate account for each Ward, and that the moneys so paid for statute labor shall not be considered as belonging to or forming part of the general funds of this municipality, nor liable to their general order.

That the Clerk do furnish to the Treasurer

a list of all persons assessed for statute labor within this municipality, together with the number of days assessed to each; the above list to be furnished to the Treasurer, within ten days after the assessment roll has been delivered to him by the As-That after the first day of June in each year the Treasurer shall return such list to the

Clerk, having first marked "paid" opposite the names of those persons who have commuted for their statute labour. That the Clerk on the receipt of such list from the Treasurer, shall at once proceed to furnish to each Overseer or Pathmaster, a list of the statute labor to be performed in his beat or ward, and no moneys shall shall be received in lieu of such labor at a less rate than one dollar per day, after the

first day of June in any year. That the Conneillors of each Ward are hereby appointed to expend the moneys so paid to the Treasurer as commutation for such labor, and the Treasurer shall pay the said moneys on the order of two of the said Councillors, who shall let the said work by public aucti n.

That the said Councillors shall, on or be fore the first Monday in September in each year, furnish to the Council of this municipality a report showing how much and what description of work has been done sons performing such work, together with all other information relative to said expenditure.
