## British and French Ironclads in Pennsylvania.

Few events of the present day are more significant or possessed of greater political importance than the visit of the Iron-clad fleet of Britain to the great naval arsenals of France. Time was when the rival fleets of these countries met only for fierce warfare, which at length ended in the almost complete annihilation of the French navy, and the loss to France of her extensive colonial possessions.
