AUDITORS' REPORT.

To the Municipal Council of the County of Victoria:

The Auditors of your Corporation for the year 1865 beg leave to report, that they have carefully examined the Books and Accounts of the Clerk and Treasurer for the year 1865, and have compared them with the Vouchers submitted therewith, and they have much pleasure in reporting them correct in every particular.

They have prepared therefrom, and now beg to submit, Abstract and Detailed Statements of the Receipts and Expenditures, a Non-Resident Tax Account, Legislative Grammar School Grant, and Common School Apportionment Account, a Poor School Fund Account, a Percentage Account, an Interest Account, a General Redemption Account, a Municipal School Apportionment, an Account of the four different Sinking Funds, and a Detailed Statement of the Assets and Liabilities, Statement of Balances, and Sinking Fund Interest Account.

It would appear from the Treasurer's Books that the County Rate due from the Town of Lindsay, for the year 1865, has not yet been paid; this will be explained by the fact that more than the amount due by Lindsay has been in Sheriff's hands since the last Sale of Lands for Taxes, arising from sale of Lots in that Town, from which the County can collect the amount of County Rate, so soon as accounted for by the Sheriff.
