was "in a Fenian procession, nor countenanced Fenianism in any shape whatever," he knew perfectly well he was writing a willful and deliberate falsehood! and how he could have the audacity to deny it, after being seen by so many, (and sctually acknowledging it himself,) is indeed beyond comprehension. I saw Mr. McCarthy walk publicly through the City of Rochester, in the Fenian procession, on the 4th of July last—and of which I am prepared to take my affidavit if necessary.

I presume. Sir, if a person is seen in an Orange, Masonic, Temperance or any other societies' procession, he must naturally be supposed, and will be held accountable, as either a member of that organization, or a hearty sympathizer in their objects; and of course the same rule will apply to Fenian processions. Mr. McCarthy must then be a Fenian, or strongly sympathizes with them; otherwise he would not publicly identify and countenance them as he did. How he can consistently do so and seek to hold a commission in our loyal Volunteer force, which was being raised for the purpose of repelling the threatened Fenian invasion, is for him to explain and reconcile and not me.

Mr. McCarthy in his affidavit does not deny marching in procession with the Fenians, but seeks by a subterfuge to draw away attention from the point in dispute by boldly declaring he never was a Femian nor never wore a Fenian badge. Nobedy accused him of this; he is only accased of marching in their procession, and this he DARE not deny on his oath.

As to his threatened action for libel, this was written, I presume, with the expectation of intimidating me into silence. In this, however, he has evidently been mistaken. In the late disturbed state of the country, and at a time when the loyalty of no man in our midst, more especially an officer of Volunteers, should be called in question, I would, by remaining silent, have been not only doing an act of injustice to my own sense of duty, but a great injustice to the country, as well as an equally great one to the men under his command.
