

Striking a match he lit a tiny alcohol lamp, and a moment after a slight motion was perceptible in the small device connected to it, and then for the first time it became apparent that the little object was a diminutive steam engine, and one of the smallest that was ever made. The whole of the engine was placed on a 25 cent gold piece, as to base, and many of its parts are so minute that they cannot be distinguished with the naked eye. The fly wheel is but \(\frac{1}{2}\) of an inch in diameter, the stroke of the piston one twenty-tourth of an inch. Boiler and engine together weigh but \(\frac{7}{2}\) grains, while the engine alone weighs but \(\frac{3}{2}\) grains. No part of a perfect working engine are wanting down even to the steam gauge. The various parts are made of gold, silver and platinum.
